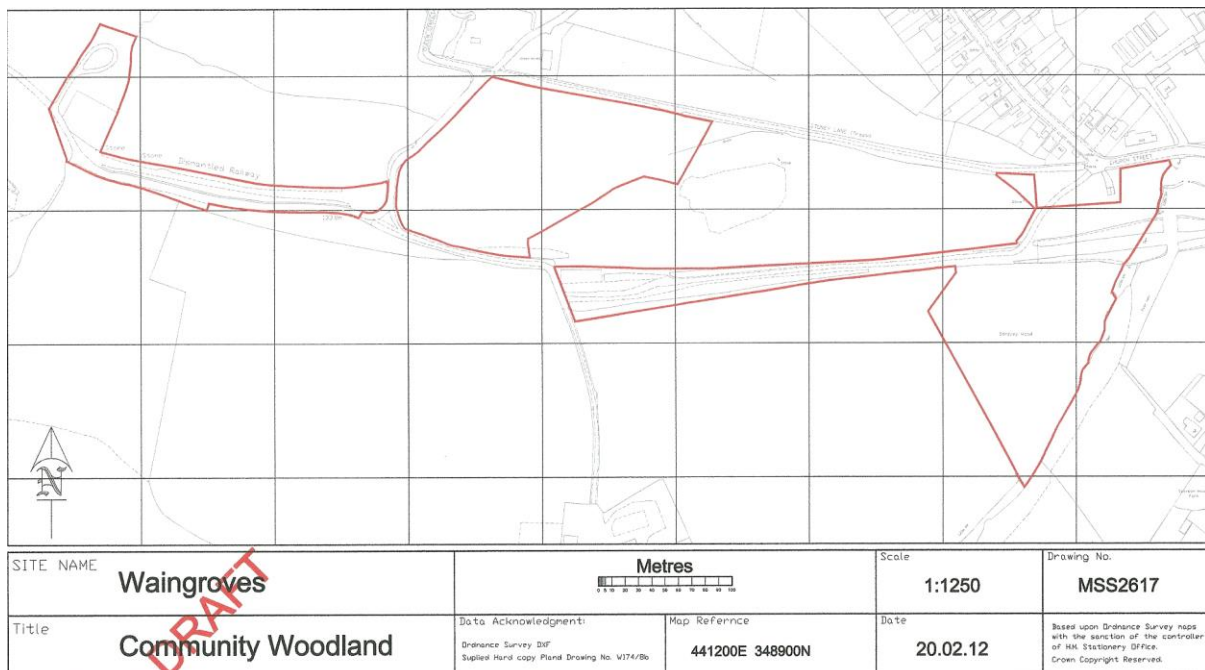

What the Trust owns

The Trust owns 12.75 acres of land to the south of Waingroves village comprising:

- Millennium Walk - a woodland path which was a railway line which serviced the colliery in Waingroves Wood
- Railway Walk - a woodland path being disused railway (Midland Railway) passing Waingroves Hall & farm and Waingroves Wood
- Strelley Wood - old beech woodland
- Waingroves Wood - the site of the village colliery closed 1923) and colonised by trees
- Whiteley Plantation - a relatively new plantation and was site of brickyard housing and farm cottages
